But an estimated **73% of Vermont workers do not have access to paid family and medical leave**.

In March 2023, the Vermont House advanced a strong paid leave bill to the Senate. With up to 12 weeks of paid leave and virtually universal coverage for Vermont's workforce, it's the package families and businesses need and deserve.
